310-1 (October, 2012)

- Homeland Security Presidential Directive (HSPD-5) requires training for all emergency responders to support the NRF; for example, NIMS: An Introduction (IS-700) and NRF: An Introduction (IS-800B). NIMS training requirements are attached to all positions identified in the PMS 310-1 and enforced for all.

310-1 (October, 2012)

- **Firefighter Type 2 (FFT₂)**
 - (Position Category: Wildland Fire)
- **REQUIRED TRAINING**
 - Basic Firefighter Training:
 - Introduction to ICS (I-100)
 - Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service (L-180)
 - Firefighter Training (S-130)
 - Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior (S-190)
 - **NIMS: An Introduction (IS-700)**
 - Annual Fireline Safety Refresher (RT-130)*

IS-700b

- Available only in English
- Can be delivered to employees not speaking English through interpreters
- Tests must be taken on-line, under employee's name
- Employee can be assisted by translator reading in employee's language
- Employee must provide answers

NWCG Memo, 11-21-11

To minimize the impact on the field in implementing the NIMS requirements, the process of **historical recognition** will be used for all current NWCG responders for ICS courses. Individuals currently qualified will continue to be considered qualified even if they have not completed all of the NIMS ICS training requirements. For anyone with an open position task book and all future trainees, they will have to complete the NIMS training requirements before being considered qualified.

NWCG Memo, 11-21-11

- All responders will be required to complete the appropriate independent study (IS) courses to be considered qualified for their current position.
- This includes IS-700a and IS-800b.

AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES (AIS)

- AIS – plants, animals, or microbes that create ecological and economic nuisance situations in natural environments.
- “Exhibit H: The resource shall arrive at the incident or designated inspection point washed and free of plant, animal, and soil debris. Equipment will be inspected and all debris removed and disposed of properly. Equipment includes, but is not limited to hoses, buckets, pumps.”
